This is a global phenomenon with many capable players pursuing the same goal. The U.S. must succeed in this AI Arms Race by quickly capturing an appropriate market share. This Panel will examine the key criteria involved in expediting the creation of new Data Centers, including stakeholder considerations, project funding and development, siting requirements, new infrastructure development, supply chain, policy/regulatory, etc. Of particular interest to this audience are considerations around accessing the extraordinary quantities of reliable electric power (utility/grid power vs. behind-the-meter on-site power), and why natural gas has emerged as the preferred fuel to generate the incremental electricity required. Potential for lower carbon, clean energy characteristics of the natural gas fuel is another consideration (RNG, Certified Gas, etc.). Entities include publicly owned and municipal utilities (subject to regulation), as well as private non-regulated businesses (now including AI Data Centers – both on the utility/grid as well as behind-the-meter utilizing on-site self-generated power). Gas Buyers for these entities have a unique perspective on the market, given their unique location at the end of the value chain, their dependence on natural gas supply, and an absolute requirement to meet the demand of their customers. Creative negotiation of commercial terms for gas supply is crucial to their business to ensure security of supply, operational flexibility and competitive pricing. In addition, the regulated entities must do all this while managing the complexities of regulatory oversight and passthrough of gas supply costs in published rates. The Panel is comprised of a diversity of Gas Buyers, offering a range of valuable perspectives and insights.
